

HOBY seeks out, recognizes, and rewards leadership potential in high school sophomores by giving them the opportunity to build their leadership potential during a three or four day seminar. High school sophomores are chosen because their age is critical in focusing on future goals and forming opinions for adulthood. These students have the unique opportunity to create a "ripple effect" from their HOBY experience by utilizing the remaining time in their high school career to lead others and lay the foundation for a strong future. HOBY challenges students on not what to think, but how to think.

They also committed to the Homeless Walk a Thon, the Town cleanup, Halloween Helpers project and trick or treat for UNICEF. Oakton has come in with almost 60 members and is also actively working their support of the needy and keeping Blake Lane clean of debris.
