

Board Actions at a Glance

The Board of Directors met on March 15, 2012 with eleven members present. Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- VP of Youth, Mike Fitzella, discussed plans for the Oratorical Contest on March 21 and the Youth Awards of Excellence scheduled for April 19 (note that this is a Thursday night) in Warhawk Hall at Madison High School auditorium. Mike pointed out that the Board needs to address the changes Optimist International (OI) has made in the eligibility for the Oratorical Contest. OI raised the age to 18, meaning competitors could now be high school students. We have continued having our contest for the middle school students, but this puts them at a disadvantage in the next level of competition. If we make this a contest for high school students, we no longer have a vehicle to engage middle school students. The Board needs to resolve this before the next school year begins.
- VP of Finance, Tom Spengler, reported that he would discuss would like to discuss some fundraising ideas at the next meeting.
- VP of Media Relations, Tom Bauer, reported that the club got coverage in the Sun-Gazette for the Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH) (front page photo) as well as the Essay Contest and that the Connection reported on both programs.
- Accepted the resignation of Samira Rantisi effective March 31
- Request for Funds

Approved a donation to support the Drug Abuse Resistance (DARE) program at Cunningham Park Elementary School. Approved a request from the American Legion Auxiliary to support the attendance of one girl at Girls' State this year.
