Board Actions at a Glance

May Board Meeting Highlights. The Board of Directors met on May 8, 2013, with 10 members present. Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- Recognized Pat Hackerson for her excellent work on the Helping Hands program.
- VP of Youth Mike Fitzella reported that the young man who won our club Oratorical Contest was the winner at the District level.
- Due to the paucity of entrants for the Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH) in our area and across the state (we only had three contestants this year and they were the only three entrants for the District Contest), the Board approved dropping the program effective immediately. Representatives of the Camelot Center (our source of contestants) and Rich Ordeman, our long-time CCDHHH program chair, concurred in the Board's decision.
- ◆ Approved the award of a \$2,500 vocational scholarship (plus up to \$100 for a gift of tools) to Nelson Hernandez from Marshall High School who will enroll in the General Motors Automotive Service Educational Program (GMASEP). This is a structured, two-year auto training program that provides students with classroom instruction as well as practical, hands-on learning.
- Approved a donation to Louise Archer Elementary School for a dunk tank and sno-cone machine for their Fun Day.
- Approved a donation to the OI Foundation in the name of late Governor Mike Tremper to help endow the second scholarship for the District Oratorical Contest.
- ◆ Approved renewing the VCB CD for six (6) months. CD will mature on November 18, 2013.
