Optimists' Support for 'Kilmer Kids' Continues

Going back to 2014, the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna has been enjoying a terrific partnership with the Kilmer Center. The Kilmer Center is a FCPS, elementary-through-high school, learning center for severely disabled students. In the spirit of supporting our youth in our community, the Optimist Club has a regular presence at the Kilmer Center and we now have a name for our program, "Kilmer Kids".

Our program continues to provide the Kids with an annual donation, weekly classroom reading and repair of the various "Enabling Devices" and "Assistive Technology" for the students. Most recently, the Club made a \$500 donation, in support of their renovation of a aging "Kitchen Classroom". With the demolition and rebuilding, new appliances will be installed to provide a more modern kitchen, allowing the best continuation of accessibility to all students.

Weekly volunteer reading, each Friday morning, by our Optimist Club members, continues to be a popular favorite of the teachers. In one visit for the older students, we read an entire chapter from Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone. The Cat-In-The-Hat series continues as a favorite for the younger students, as well reading from the as the Pete The Cat series.

Lastly, the repair cycle for those many devices that enable students to communicate, continues to run well this fall. These devices are unique, smaller electronic items that range from being Somosensory devices, switches, enabling toys, video cameras, radios and just about any device that a severely disabled student would use for interaction and learning with the teachers. The
