# Wet Paint!

Keeping our big, red Caboose looking good is no small task! This year Caboose Honcho Dan Mulville assembled a crew and tackled the job of giving the Vienna icon a good scraping and a top-to-bottom paint job—the first since 2012. We also had the help of Mike Cheleska, who spray painted the roof walkway and worked on the caboose team. Vienna Paint and Decorating donated 10 gallons of paint along with 3

The W&OD decals will be installed later this summer after the paint has thoroughly dried. Painting the interior of the caboose will be scheduled later this year during cooler weather.
