The Optimist Club's 2018 Christmas Tree Sales

You bet it's gonna be merry!

What: Our biggest fund-raiser of the year. Five weeks of tree sales, along with our increasing revenue from the Farmers Market, funds our Youth Programs for the entire year.

Where: We set up shop in the northeast corner of the Giant Food parking lot, next to the PNC Bank (which generously provides us with electricity for the lot).

When: Sales start on Saturday, November 24, at 9:00 a.m. We operate seven days a week until December 23, or we sell out of trees, whichever comes first.

Who: ALL OF US!

Why: To bring out the best in the kids of our greater Vienna community.

2018 Schedule of Operation

Saturday, November 17, 9:30 a.m.: Lot Set-up. Bring work gloves and a hammer.

Tuesday, November 20, 6:00 p.m.: First delivery of trees. As always, the Madison High School baseball team will be helping us make quick work of unloading a whole bunch of trees.

Friday, November 23, 10:30 a.m.: Second delivery of trees and final lot set up.

Saturday, November 24: Sales begin at 9:00 a.m.

Lot Hours: Saturdays and Sundays, 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Weekdays, 2:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Captains for the RED, ORANGE, BLUE, GREEN, and SUNSHINE teams will be contacting members to sign up for shifts on the Tree Lot. We will have help from our various JOI Clubs and other youth organizations, but we must have Optimist Club members on the Lot. Volunteer early and often.

Encourage your friends, neighbors, co-workers, relatives, and complete strangers to purchase their Christmas trees, wreaths and garlands at the Optmist Club Tree Lot. Remember, if we sell it all early, we wrap up early!
