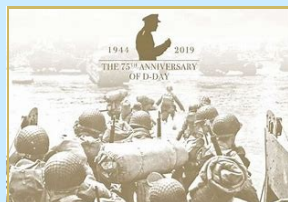

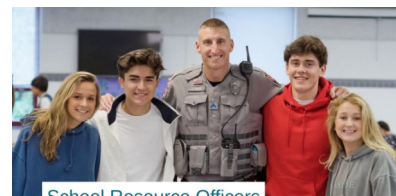

May 2019 Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

The Board of Directors of the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna met on May 8, 2019, with nine members present (plus one by proxy). Among the items of business conducted were the following:

- Additional expenditures were approved, including: \$1500 for President-Elect Bruce’s attendance at the OI Annual Convention; and \$300 to sponsor the Marshall High School Band’s trip to Pearl Harbor to perform in December 2019 (Past-President Michelle will add \$200 to this in honor of her father-in-law).
- The nominated slate of officers for 2019-20 was approved by the online vote.
- The Club’s website migration from Goozmo is complete. Consolidating email addresses under the “info@” address will save \$140 per year.
- Farmers Market was “officially” opened with a ribbon-cutting attended by Vienna Mayor and Town Council. New rules prohibiting sign placement in the grass go into effect when the Town’s new irrigation system is installed. Two Madison students will be working on Farmers Market media postings.
