# April 2019 Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

The Board of Directors met on April 10 with eight members present plus two by proxy. Among the highlights of the meeting were:

- Approval to disburse budgeted funds to Madison All-Night Grad Party, Kilmer Center, and Oratorical Contest Expenses.
- Approval in principle to use existing funds from the Childhood Cancer Campaign to support DC Lamplighters, a group that hosts parties for children with cancer. Specifics will be presented at the May Board Meeting.
- Approval to sponsor a JOI Club at Thoreau Middle School.
- Report from the Farmers Market Committee that the agreement with the Town has been signed; some terms, including those regarding signs, are more restrictive.
- Announcement that the Fairfax American Legion property has been sold and will be undergoing renovations.

Don't worry if you have to change your response—you can do that with no problem. And SUG will automatically send you a reminder of the upcoming event.

Please accept the SignUp Genius email when it arrives and use it to record your rsvp.
