News and Notes

Our Farmers Market WILL OPEN this year, on Saturday, June 13! Market Manager Michele reports that the Vienna Town Council (which hosts the Market at the Vienna Community Center) has agreed to the opening under a FARMERS WMARKET modified operating procedure consistent with Virginia Department of Agriculture guidelines. New rules for the Market include:



- Masks and gloves for vendors;
- Ten feet spacing between vendors;
- No sampling;
- Masks for customers:
- Six feet spacing between customers:
- No more than 30 customers in the Market at any time;
- No congregation of more than 10 people in one place;
- No touching of produce by customers ("point and pack" by vendor)
- Credit cards preferred over cash;
- Pre-orders directly with vendors encouraged.

We as Market volunteers will be responsible for enforcing these rules. including prohibiting entry to anyone not wearing a mask and dispersing any groups of more than 10 people. Our skilled and resourceful Webmaster Gary is working on means to facilitate on-line preorders.

Optimists can help in two important ways: (1) Sign up on the Club website to **volunteer** at the Market, and (2) commit to being a regular customer! Many of our vendors have been hit hard by restaurant closures and supply chain interruptions. They have been faithful to us for years and they need our support now.



April 2020 Board Meeting Highlights

The Board of Directors of the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna held a regular meeting on Wednesday, April 15, 2020, with nine members present by video conference.

Among the business conducted were the following matters:

- Heard report from Treasurer Michele on effects of COVID-19 cancelations on budget. Some expenses for planned programs will be rolled over and applied to next year. At this point it does not appear we will have to tap reserve funds.
- Discussed dues and membership-related costs, including meals, and possible alternatives to current meeting structure.
- Agreed to move forward with the Investment Committee's recommendations for Club and Foundation portfolios; agreed to a quarterly reporting schedule from the Committee.
- Received an update from the Farmers Market managers (see related story on page 1).
- Reviewed cancelled Youth programs and plans for Respect for Law and First Responder meetings in June and July.



We note with sadness the loss of our friend and fellow Optimist **Dr**. **Joe Bosco, DDS,** who passed away in his sleep April 21, 2020, at age 97.

Joe joined the brand new Vienna Optimist Club in 1955. He served as our 8th President, in 1962-63. Joe was a Life Member and—while

we still tracked these things—was very proud of his "perfect attendance." Because you could get credit for attending an extra meeting if you missed a regular meeting, Joe would occasionally pop into a Board meeting to make up for a missed dinner meeting. Joe was a fixture at a certain table in the days when we dined at Marco Polo restaurant, enjoying the company of other long-time members.
