The clubs at Marshall and Madison have provided tutors to the program offered by Belong!, a local community organization, for students at Cunningham Park Elementary and expect this to continue next year as Belong! expands."

More \$\$ for Scholarships and Awards: Our Board recently voted to increase our scholarships and contest awards. The Carol Waite Brennan Scholarships for high school seniors will be \$2500 per student. The

Vocational Scholarship and Sheryl Friedley Scholarship will also increase to \$2500 each; the Jim Houston Leadership Award will be \$1000. Prizes for the Essay Contest, Oratorical Contest, and TR Cook Youth of Excellence Awards have been doubled. Our donations via the Helping Hands Awards were increased to \$300 per elementary school.

- Received report from Farmers Market managers that all available spaces are filled and musicians lined up for all dates; discussed means to engage more volunteers for Market duty.
