Raouf Youssef is a former U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) Foreign Service Officer for over 34 years having served in 5 overseas missions and several regional missions. While at USAID, Mr. Youssef managed the power and telecommunications portfolio (1.6B) in Egypt and led the effort to privatize the telecommunications sector and commercialize the power sector in Egypt. He also served in Lebanon and was acting Deputy Chief of Mission during the war of 2006. Mr. Youssef retired from USAID as Senior Development Counselor for the Middle East in 2010. He was also called to serve on the CENTCOM joint strategic assessment team for the Middle East, covering Egypt, Lebanon, Yemen, West Bank/Gaza and Jordan in 2008/9. He is currently on the Board of Directors of several NGOs and other organizations and is Managing Partner of Global Development Associates, LLC.

No Board meeting was held in December 2021.

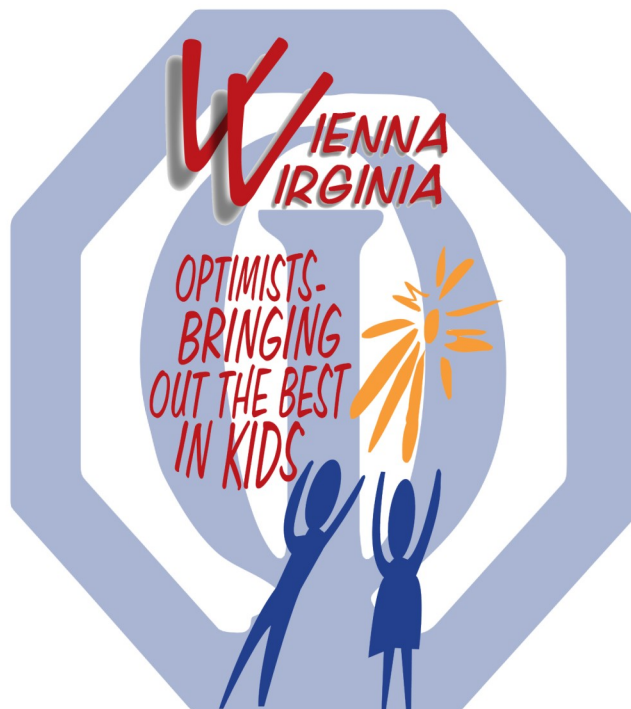
