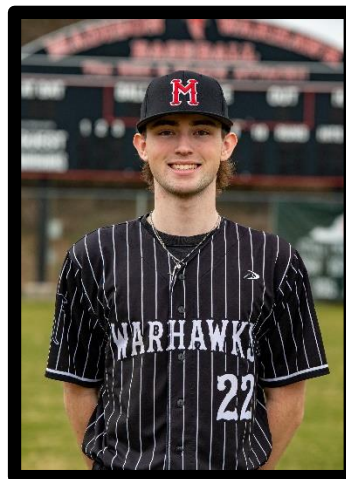
Jim Houston Leadership Award

The winner of this year's Jim Houston Leadership Award is Jackson Bourdeau.

We created the Jim Houston Leadership Award in 2021 in Jim's memory to recognize a senior who embodies the characteristics that Jim liked about the Madison baseball players: one who shows leadership on a consistent basis throughout the year, and is a player of high character who does the right thing because it's the right thing to do.

In his application essay, Jackson said the following about community service: "I believe that participating in community service can be especially transformative to young adults, providing valuable life lessons, enhancing personal growth, and fostering a sense of social responsibility. Further, it helps to bridge the gap between diverse socio-economic groups, enriches individual lives, and strengthens communities."

Composting Available

Composting is now available at the Vienna Farmer's Market. Please bring food waste in a certified-compostable bag or container. Guidelines for compost are shown in the graphic below.

Some interesting facts about compost include:

- Compost can hold 2-3 times its weight in water. This makes it great for retaining moisture.
- Compost contains a number of beneficial microbes that help prevent diseases. It also stimulates plant growth.
- Compost has macro and micro nutrients along with several trace minerals.



Did You Know?

During World War II, it became obvious that normal peacetime supplies of scrap metal would soon be exhausted in the manufacture of arms and munitions. The government called upon citizens to salvage 17 million tons of scrap metal. To do their part, Optimist Clubs joined forces to start the official Optimist Scrap Metal Drives. The organizations effort in this and many subsequent home-front campaigns during World War II is considered by many as the organization's highest achievement. Optimist International was awarded a special citation from the War Production Board for its collection of thousands of tons of sorely needed scrap metal and rubber.
